City Council Meeting! Numerous members of the public were in attendance at the Robert Lee City Council meeting held Monday, May 8, 2017. The week prior to Monday's meeting, two petitions were circulated throughout town offering different viewpoints on the sea containers placed near the intersection of Highway 208 and Austin Street. Leta Caston, owner of This 'N That Shop and Caston Company, LLC, owns the lots and containers in dispute. Before purchasing the containers, she made calls to determine that no Robert Lee City Ordinance would be violated. At Monday's council meeting, it was stated that Robert Lee currently had no ordinances regulating sea containers. Noel Tinkler (pictured above) presented a petition opposing the placement of the containers in such a prominent position at the intersection of two highways. Several citizens addressed the council on both sides of the issue. Mrs. Caston stated that she would like to have an occasional flea market at the location. She mentioned that the day prior to the meeting, the location was used for a benefit lunch for Toni Rainwater's medical fund. She further stated she would welcome all local organizations to take advantage of the location for their fundraisers. The city

council voted that Mrs. Caston would have to get a business license in order to operate a business from the containers. The business license requirement was a result of Ordinance 1249 dated September 8, 2014. Several ordinances were passed at the 2014 meeting, but #1249 was not one of those published in the local newspaper of record. The ordinance is now online and available to the public at ObserverEnterprise.com under the "Contracts" tab.
