(Continued from previous page) February had one warning and four citations issued for dogs at large, not registered with the city, and burning in the city limits.

City Secretary Teresa Ballard

reported that the trapper caught 24 feral cats, one raccoon, one opossum, five skunks, two squirrels, and six dogs for January. All dogs were claimed. For February there were two domestic cats, four feral cats, six skunks, three opossums, two raccoons, and four dogs. Three dogs were claimed and one was euthanized. A citizen spoke from the audience to address a concern.

Council member Kinley Pritchard has had a few complaints from citizens on the trapper. One citizen was at home and noticed the city trapper outside across the street and when they came out, she drove off. This has happened multiple times from what Kinley has been told and is concerning to him. Another citizen was inside watching her dog in the yard and the trapper was trying to lure the dog out of the yard. When confronted, the trapper said it was a registered dog check. Since being on the council, Kinley has noticed not good feelings between the citizens, city, and city council. He does think the city needs trapping. Gwen Dyess spoke of one concern and said that she felt it has gotten better since she spoke to Tiffany Harendt, the trapper. Mayor Gohman and Teresa Ballard went over the trapper duties with everyone. Mayor Gohman asked if this went beyond driving around and patrolling the city for loose dogs. Kinley Pritchard said yes it seemed to be and how she is interacting with the citizens. He also said it needs to be know that everyone is all on the same page and as a community he felt that this could be worked out. Tiffany Harendt said that she turns in a log each week reporting every time she has contact with or sees and animal and what is said to the citizen. She said "if it is not in the log, it didn't happen." Kinley

Pritchard said when animals are loose, why citations are being given without warnings. Deputy Neal spoke that a ticket is given when animals are miles from their home and not on the same street as their owners property. Mrs. Holland was upset that she did not get a warning before a citation. Ron Cooper agreed that everyone needs to be on the same page even though each situation is different. Citizens need to know the liabilities of having an animal and following the ordinances. Gwen Dyess said that we all know animals get out and as an animal owner must be responsible owners. Mrs. Pritchard asked if the Animal Control Official's job description can be public.

Tiffany Kay Sullivan spoke that the things on Facebook were her and that everyone comes to her so she feels that she needs to post it. Gwen Dyess said that if there is a complaint about the ACO, they need to come and report it in person or in writing to City Hall. Mr. Holland spoke up that he is having problems with the ACO harassing his family and luring his dogs. Stormy Vaughn spoke that she had a couple of people call her. She said that an ordinance was put into place because of an action that happened a few years back. Stormy said that if a complaint had been made, that a written warning needs to be done and kept on file. Tiffany Harendt had reported the incident with
