



Of those 723,013 tested, there are 48,693 confirmed cases spread over 221 of Texas' 254 counties. Thirteen forty-seven Texans have lost their lives to the virus as of presstime. In Texas, 6.73% of all people tested are confirmed to have the virus, and of those confirmed cases, 2.76% result in death. Worldwide, the rate of death of those confirmed to have Covid-19 has dropped to from a high

7.00% two weeks ago. For the United States, the death rate is 6.00%, dropping slightly from the 6.02% of last week.
