- 4. A spotter with water and a ready pressurized delivery system must be on hand before any burning begins and remain on hand until the outdoor cooking is completed.

## Eddie Eagle GunSafe Program Presented in Robert Lee

School children in Robert Lee learned the lifesaving message of the National Rifle Association's Eagle GunSafe® Program. Shaunna Grantham, President of Red Canyon Gun Club, presented the awardwinning program to the children at Robert Lee Elementary on May 8, 2018. This was the first time that the Eddie Eagle GunSafe® Program has been taught in Robert Lee.

Eddie Eagle® is a gun accident prevention program designed for children in pre-K through the 4th grades. It teaches children that, if they find a gun, they should: "STOP! Don't Touch. Run Away. Tell a Grown-Up."

Accidental deaths with firearms have been decreasing for decades and are now at an alltime low among the U.S. population. Gun accident prevention programs are widely considered to be a major reason for the decline. Studies from the National Center for Health Statistics indicate approximately

an 80 percent drop in fatal firearm accidents among children in the Eddie Eagle age range since the nationwide Eddie Eagle Program launch.

The program was created by past NRA President Marion P. Hammer, in consultation with child psychologists, elementary school teachers, and law enforcement officers. Now in its 30th year the program has reached over 31 million children nationwide. It has been endorsed by The National Sheriff's Association recognized by the Association of American Educators. It is a recipient of The American Legion's National Education Award, and has been praised by a host of national and community organizations, governors and state legislatures for its effectiveness.

"The Eddie Eagle GunSafe Program continues to receive outstanding feedback from program users and parents", said Eric Lipp, National Manager of the Community Outreach Department.

"I am tremendously happy to be able to say that Eddie Eagle has now reached over 31 million children with it's life saving message."
