Commissioners Reject Offer! Pastor James Brunson, representing the 4C Cowboy Church in Bronte, addresses the Commissioners Tuesday morning. The church had asked to be on the agenda for Commissioners Court to present an offer to purchase the old detention facility in Bronte. Brunson explained the church was interested in the facility to house their church, to install a daycare for county residents, to host youth camps and Walks to Emmaus, and build an arena to hold playdays, rodeos, etc. A representative of the American Red Cross also addressed the Commissioners regarding partnering with the church to use the facility during disaster situations. The Commissioners voted unanimously to reject the church's offer and chose not to counter the offer although this is the first official offer the county has received in the years the facility has been listed with a realtor. The church has asked to once again be on the agenda at the Commissioners Court to be held at 9 am Tuesday morning, June 28, 2016, to present another offer.

The BHRC Auxiliary meetings are held every month except June, July, August and December. The monthly meetings are held every third Tuesday at 1:00 p.m. in the dining room at the BHRC.
