5th Annual Clay Antilley Invitational Golf Tourney slated for Saturday, June 23



The 5th Annual Clay Antilley Golf Tournament is slated for Saturday June 23, at the Mountain Creek Golf Club. The tournament is to honor Clay and raise money for the Golf Scholarship in his name that has given more than \$22,000 the last three years to area youth. Clay's involvement in golf, 4-H and FFA made Clay a favorite son to Coke County.

The tournament will begin at 12 noon, with a lunch provided for golfers and family at 11 am. The tournament will be a shotgun start, three person select shot with prizes given in three flights for the top two teams and one of Clay's Git'R Done trophies for a team to be selected from the remaining teams. A long drive and
