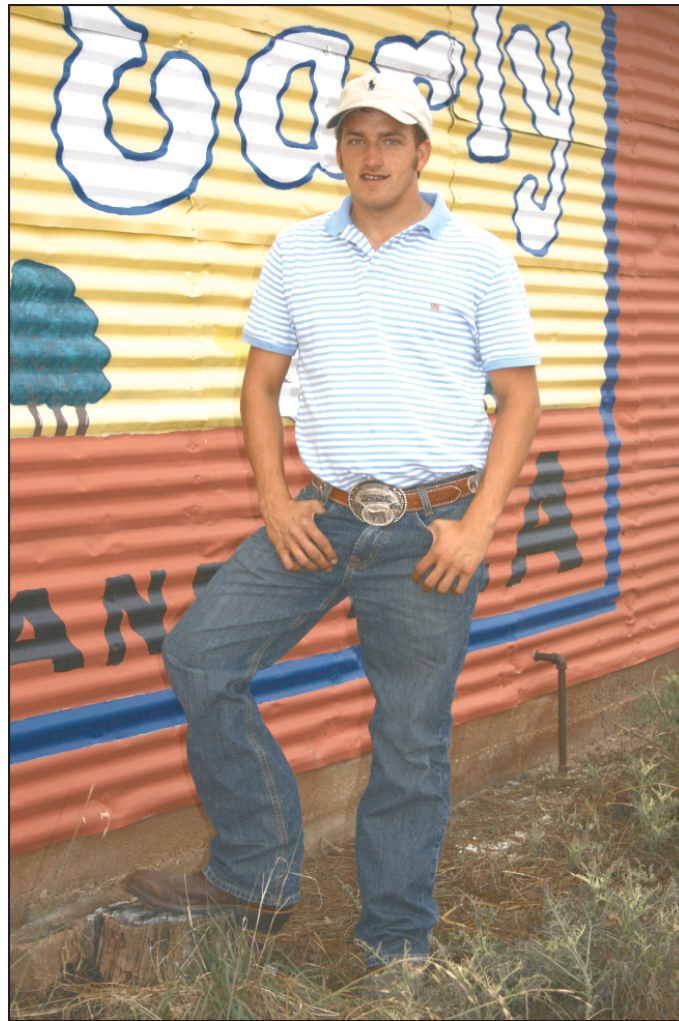
9th Annual Clay Antilley Invitation Tournament set for Saturday

The tournament, honoring Clay's memory, raises money for Robert Lee seniors. This year, \$9,950 was given in scholarships. Since the event began, \$60,000 in scholarships has been awarded. Clay, the son of Tommy and Kei Antilley and a favorite son of Robert Lee, was extremely active in golf, 4-H, and FFA.

The tournament will have two tee times, 9 am and 2 pm. A lunch will be provided for golfers and their families at appx 12:30. The tournament will be a shotgun start, three person select shot with awards given to the top three finishers in each of the three flights. A long drive contest will be held for both men and women and closest to the pin prizes will be awarded on 2 holes.

Following the tournament, there will be a dinner for the players, families and contributors to the tournament. The night's musical entertainment will be provided by Rough Creek.
