### Republican Primary Election run-off set for July 31

In Coke County, the Republican Primary Election to determine the candidates to be placed on the November General Election ballot resulted in the need for a run-off election in four statewide political races.

The most widely publicized race is for retiring senator Kay Bailey Hutchinson's United States Senate seat. Current Texas Lieutenant Governor David Dewhurst is battling Ted Cruz, a Tea Party favorite who has served as Texas Solicitor General.

Candidates for Railroad Commissioner (full term) are Warren Chisum and Christi Craddick. Warren Chisum serves as State Representative from Pampa and faces Christi Craddick who is an attorney and small business owner in Austin.
