Coke County Commissioners Court meeting minutes told

The Coke County Commissioners Court met in special session on June 25, 2019, at 9 am at the courthouse in Robert Lee. Those in attendance were County Judge Hal Spain, Commissioner Precinct 1 Donnie Robertson, Commissioner Precinct 2 Paul Williams, Commissioner Precinct 3 Marshall Millican, Commissioner Precinct 4 Joe Sefcik and Deputy Clerk Jennifer Burdett.

The meeting opened with the pledge to the flag and prayer was offered by Judge Hal Spain.

Judge Spain announced the presence of a quorum.

Commissioner Millican moved to approve the minutes. The motion, seconded by Commissioner Sefcik, carried.

Commissioner Williams moved to approve the Treasurer's Report and was seconded by Commissioner Robertson. The motion carried.

Commissioner Robertson moved to reinstate the burn ban. The motion died for lack of a second.

Commissioner Williams moved to approve declaring the old shredder, one desk from the County Attorney's office, and one desk from the old election

room, as salvage. The motion, seconded by Commissioner Sefcik, carried.

Commissioner Williams moved to approve the budget amendment for unforeseen legal fees from Charles R. Kimbrough with Bickerstaff Heath Delgado Acosta LLC for legal consultations regarding the BNB Tennyson Solar LLC project in the amount of \$18,543.94. The motion, seconded by Commissioner Millican, carried.

Commissioner Williams moved to approve action on Line Item Transfers and was seconded by Commissioner Sefcik. The motion carried.

Commissioner Sefcik moved to approve action on Green Mountain Subdivision Plat changes and was seconded by Commissioner Robertson. The motion carried.

Commissioner Williams moved to approve the Coke County Precinct Redistricting Application. The motion, seconded by Commissioner Robertson, carried.

Commissioner Williams moved to approve action on Texas Association of Counties Health and Employee Benefits Pool. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Millican and carried.

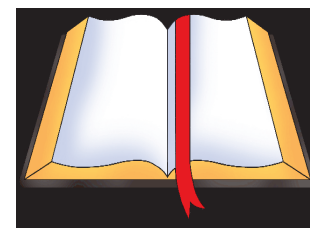
