Continued from page 3) Goodwin observes that these men commonly wrote lengthy, flowing, often emotional letters to male friends, because the era valued close relationships between people. Over time, our culture began to sneer at close relationships of all kinds, but especially between men (men can’t be emotional, remember!). This sowed the seeds of today's lack of sincerity
It seems to me that we could use a lot less irony, a lot less sarcasm, and a lot less snark, and a whole lot more sincerity and close relationships today.
