## Twenty-six active cases in Coke County

What a difference a week makes. Last week, Coke County showed only one active case of Covid-19. As of presstime, Coke County had 26 active cases and 32 overall confirmed cases with 1 fatality and 5 recoveries. Due to printing restrictions, our presstime is Monday prior to Friday's publication. Because of this time lag, both the active case Texas county map and overall confirmed case Texas county map, along with Texas statistics table are updated daily at ObserverEnterprise.com.

Governor Abbott's executive order now calls for additional restrictions to be placed upon our citizens because Coke County has gone above the 20 active case threshold. One of these requirements is that face masks must be worn in all public spaces. Other requirements place 10 person restrictions on gatherings with certain exceptions.

Tom Green County began the month with 312 confirmed cases. This rose to 1,463 confirmed cases by Monday of this week. The daily new case number came in at 13 on July 1st and was 15 on July 27th. A high of 311 on July 24 was

followed on July 18 by a removal of 208 cases. Tom Green County also had 6 fatalities removed leaving them with a total of 10 on July 27. They began the month with 189 active cases and ended with 827. A high number of active cases occurred on July 18 with 1,014 active cases in Tom Green County.

Taylor County began the month with 400 confirmed cases and were at 1,012 on July 27. Their daily new case count showed a high of 54 on July 12, but was down to 5 by July 27. Active case counts began with 76 on July 1 and ended on July 27 with 461 active cases with that number being their overall active case daily high. Taylor County had 5 fatalities due to Covid-19 on July 1 and that number increased to 16 by July 27.

There are 78 confirmed cases in Runnels County with 33 active cases. Nolan County has 122 confirmed cases, 55 of which are active. Mitchell County has 41 confirmed cases, 16 of which are active. Sterling County is our only neighboring county to have not had any confirmed cases of Covid-19.

### BISD registration to be done online

Bronte ISD has launched an online portal for all new and returning students to register for school. The link is located at <https://bronte.txeis15.net/ParentPortal/login?distid=041901>. This method will be replacing the paper packets used previously. All parents will be required to fill out this information for their children.

Students new to the district (never enrolled at BISD) will visit the link above and click on 'New Student Enrollment' at the bottom of the page and follow the registration forms. If a page won't save, it will highlight in red what was skipped. Please be prepared to upload required documents,

such as proof of residence, your child's social security card, your child's birth certificate, and your driver's license.

Returning students will click on the link and login to the Parent Portal. Make sure to update your account with all new phone numbers and to add emergency contacts if you want someone other than a parent/guardian to pick up your child. ### Early voting extended until October 30

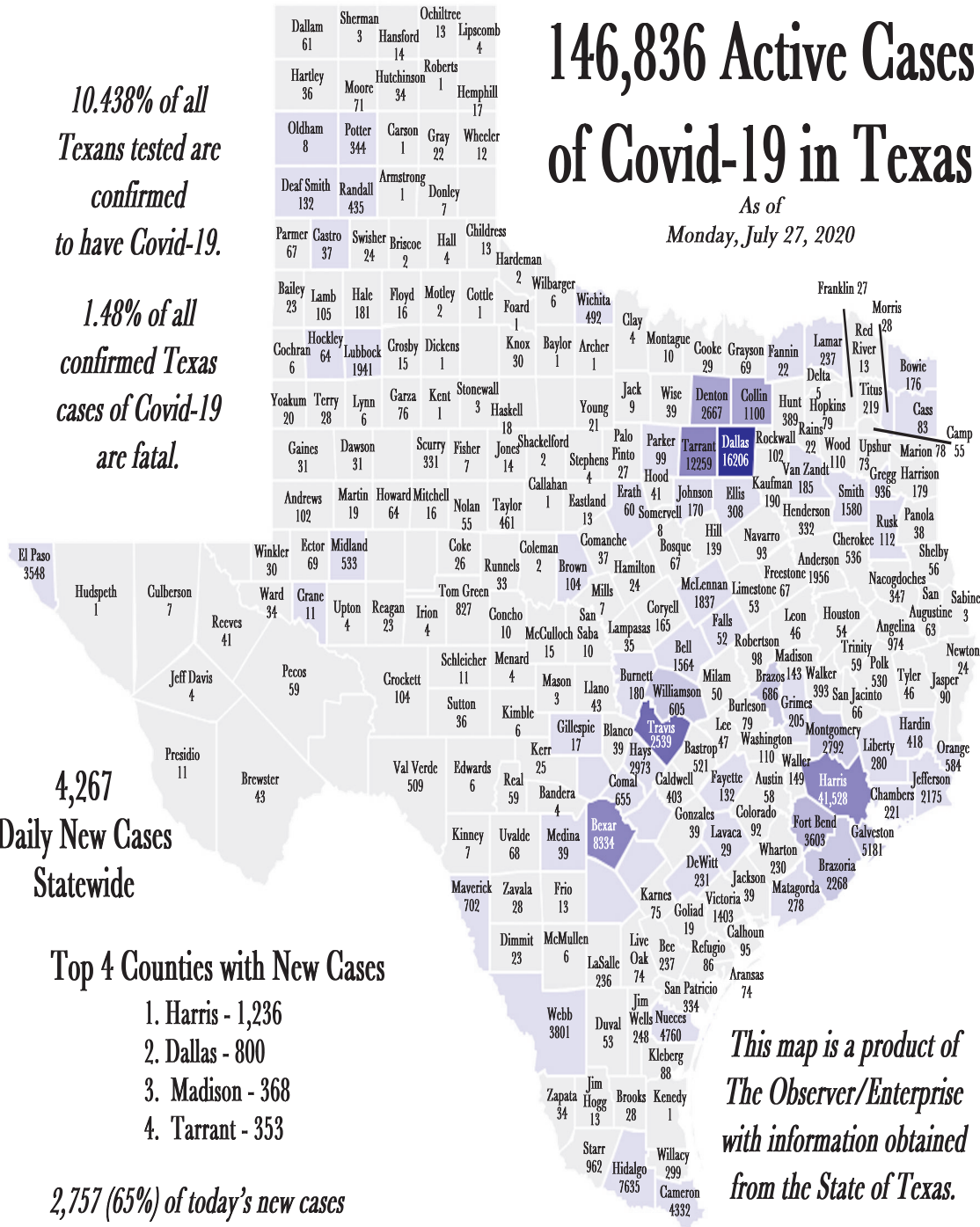
