In Coke County, the **Republican Primary Election** to determine the candidates to be placed on the November General Election ballot resulted in the need for a run-off election in four statewide political races.

The most widely publicized race is for retiring senator Kay Bailey Hutchinson's United States Senate seat. Current Texas Lieutenant Governor David Dewhurst is battling Ted Cruz, a Tea Party favorite who has served as Texas Solicitor General.
