

3. My child's application was approved last year. Do I need to fill out a new one? Yes. An application is only good for that school year and the first few days of this school year. You must send in a new application unless the school told you that your child is eligible for this school year. 4. If I don't qualify now, may I apply later? Yes. You may apply at any time during the school year. A

child with a parent or guardian who becomes unemployed may become eligible for free and reduced-price meals if the household income drops below the income limit.

5. What if my income is not always the same? List the amount that you normally receive. If a household member lost a job or had hours/wages reduced, use current income. 6. We are in the military. Do we report our income differently? Basic pay and cash bonuses must be reported as income.
