#### Zika Virus continues to affect US citizens

As of July 27, there were more than 6,400 (+1,200 compared to last week) confirmed cases of Zika virus in U.S. States and Territories.

Current statistics are below.

1,658 (+254) confirmed cases of Zika in U.S. States and Washington DC.

4,750 (+923) confirmed cases of Zika in U.S. Territories.

Pregnant women with evidence of Zika virus: As of July 27, there were more than 850 pregnant women with evidence of Zika virus.

433 (+33) pregnant women in U.S. States and Washington, DC.

422 (+44) pregnant women in U.S. Territories.

#### Protect your family from Mosquitoborne disease

The recent rains have been a huge blessing to Coke County but not everything that comes after is a blessing. The puddles that have formed and the various containers that have filled with water are great breeding grounds for that pesky mosquito. The Aedes aegypti mosquito has been identified as the primary vector transmission of Zika, dengue, chikungunya, and West Nile. The Zika virus has had a large spotlight in the media recently and for good reason. Zika virus is the cause of the increased microcephaly. Microcephaly is a condition affecting unborn children where the baby's head is much smaller than expected due to the underdevelopment of the baby's brain. So far there have not been any confirmed cases of Zika caused by mosquito populations in the state of Texas. Those that have been infected by the bite of an infected mosquito have either traveled to an area with Zika carrying mosquitos or their (Continued on Page 8)
