(Continued from front page) As of today (Friday, August 7), we can add all 12 of the cases which have been attributed to the Robert Lee Care Center as being recovered, a fact that we are all celebrating in unison with the RLCC. When you subtract those cases from the 20 active cases, that leaves eight. Seven of those cases are in Robert Lee, and one is at Oak Creek Lake. This Oak Creek case was inadvertently Blackwell last week due to only reporting the subject's mailing address. Of those seven cases in Robert Lee, one was supposed to be recovered as of August 5, and two cases will be on the recovered list as of today, August

That just leaves five cases total that are still active in the county. This is great news, but now is not the time to let our guard down. Schools are opening in the county this next week, and it is imperative that we maintain social distance, wear masks when indoors in public places, and avoid groups of more than ten people. We have the numbers going in the right direction, and now is not the time change our good behavior. Hopefully we will have a vaccine before the end of the year, and we can put this pandemic in our rearview mirror.

(Continued from previous page) Specialty Crops - aloe leaves, bananas, batatas, bok choy, carambola (star fruit), cherimoya, chervil (french parsley), citron, curry leaves, daikon, dates, dill, donqua (winter melon), dragon fruit (red pitaya), endive, escarole, filberts, frisee, horseradish, kohlrabi, kumquats, leeks, mamey sapote, maple sap (for maple mesculin mix. syrup), microgreens, nectarines, parsley, persimmons. plantains, pummelos, pomegranates, pumpkins, rutabagas, shallots, turnips/celeriac, tangelos, turmeric, upland/winter cress, water cress, yautia/malanga, and yuca/cassava.

Non-Specialty Crops and Livestock - liquid eggs, frozen eggs and all sheep. Only lambs and yearlings (sheep less than two years old) were previously eligible.


Aquaculture - catfish, crawfish, largemouth bass and carp sold live as foodfish, hybrid striped bass, red drum, salmon, sturgeon, tilapia, trout, ornamental/tropical fish, and recreational sportfish.

Nursery Crops and Flowers nursery crops and cut flowers.

Other changes to CFAP include:

Seven commodities – onions (green), pistachios, peppermint, walnuts spearmint, watermelons - are now eligible for Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Stability (CARES) Act funding for sales losses.
