**Commissioners Court
minutes posted**

The Coke County Commissioners Court met in special session July 28, 2014, at the courthouse in Robert Lee. Members of the court present included County Judge, Roy Blair, Commissioner, Pct. #1 Troy Montgomery,

Commissioner, Pct. #2 Wendell Lee, Commissioner, Pct. #3 Gaylon Pitcock. Clerk Mary Grim was also in attendance.

The meeting opened with prayer given by Judge Blair and pledge to the flag was recited.

Judge Blair announced the presence of a quorum. Comm. Blaylock was absent.

A public hearing was held to discuss SB 1685-District Court Records and Technology Fund and the Archive Fee at 9:00 am.

Mary Grim, County/District Clerk explained that a public hearing has to be held for these fees during the budget process. She presented her plan for next year continuing with the process of archiving deed records and imagining. At the present time she has a certificate of deposit for the archive fee of \$35,833.18 and has collected \$7,858.50 for the budget year through July 22. Out of this fund \$10,104.00 will be spent on the reproduction of land records. The clerk also has a certificate of deposit for records management of \$23,310.71 of which \$5,693.05 that will be used for reproducing records from film to images for the public computer. She has collected \$7,480.00 so far for the budget year.

Judge Blair adjourned the public hearing at 9:10 am. No action was taken.

The Court entered special meeting at 9:10 am.

Comm. Lee made a motion to approve the minutes for July 14 and July 22. The motion was

seconded by Comm. Pitcock. Motion carried.

No action was taken on the burn ban. The burn ban will remain on.

Tommy Morris and Nancy with Tommy Morris insurance made their presentation to the Court on the insurance renewal.

Comm. Lee made a motion to approve the renewal plan. The motion was seconded by Comm. Montgomery. Motion carried.

Comm. Pitcock made a motion to approve the bonds for deputy clerks Kyla Garcia in the County/District Clerk’s office and Rosa Longoria in the Tax Assessor/Collectors office. The motion was seconded by Comm. Montgomery. Motion carried.

Comm. Lee made a motion to approve the SB 1685-District Court Records and Technology Fund and Archive Fee Plan. The motion was seconded by Comm. Montgomery. Motion carried.

Comm. Pitcock made a motion to renew the Contract and Agreement for Detention of Juvenile Offenders with TomGreen County. The motion was seconded by Comm. Montgomery. Motion carried.

County Clerk Mary Grim reported that we would be holding an election September 9 to fill the vacancy of Senator Robert Duncan’s seat.

Judge Blair reported that Hal was hurt and Bobby had surgery. He also reported Judge

Coulter called about air conditioner in the annex.

There being no private road would requests, no action was taken.

Comm. Montgomery made a motion to pay the mills. The motion was seconded by Comm. Lee. Motion carried.

Comm. Montgomery made a motion to approve the repair of the backhoe and grader for Pct. 2 and 4 to Yellow House. The motion was seconded by Comm. Pitcock. Motion carried.

Court recessed at 9:45 am and reconvened at 10 am for a budget workshop.

Judge Blair adjourned the meeting at 10:20 am.
