### Frenship man to be trustee for School for the Blind

`Daughters have a way of inspiring fathers to action, and North Ridge Elementary School student Scout Sonnenberg inspired her own father.

Lee Sonnenberg was appointed to the governing board of trustees for the Texas School for the Blind and Visually Impaired earlier this summer.

All three of Lee Sonnenberg's children have congenital glaucoma, but Scout's case is worse than that of her older siblings.

Sonnenberg said the family is lucky to have "amazing" services for Scout, but he said Sherry Airhart recommended that she go to a summer camp at the Texas School for the Blind and Visually Impaired, or TSBVI, last summer.

"I was just so impressed with the school and the camps and the way it was run," Sonnenberg said. "Scout grew so much in that week. It really benefited her to be around kids that have the same issues, the same challenges."

Scout became much more confident, Sonnenberg said.

"As a parent, I was just so amazed to see that," he said.

After bringing Scout home from that first camp, Sonnenberg said he wanted to contribute to the school, but he knew he couldn't volunteer in a classroom because TSBVI is in Austin.

But in looking at the school board online, he noticed a spot was open for a parent member. TSBVI has nine appointed members, including three former students with visual impairments, three parents of students with visual impairments and three people who work with students with visual impairments.

"That position is one they have a hard time filling because it's so specialized," Sonneberg said.

After applying and speaking to local politicians, he said it took him nine months to be appointed as a trustee, a role he will have for six years. end programs offered here, or they could go as a large group to camps offered at TSBVI.

"I guess that's one of my main goals, just to make sure more kids from this area can participate or benefit from this school," Sonnenberg said.

Since the trip to camp last year, Sonnenberg said Scout has attended other classes at TSBVI, including a recent two-week stint at the school. In addition to academic classwork in the mornings and field trips in the afternoons, Scout was required to help prepare her own meals and do chores.

"She was gone for 11 or 12 days. For us, that was the longest she's ever been away from the family. It was kind of hard," Sonnenberg said. "She just loves it. Every time she comes home, there is a marked change in her." Sonnenberg is associate

director for parking and transportation services at Texas Tech.
