Those in attendance included County Judge Hal Spain, Commissioner Precinct 1 Donald Robertson, Commissioner Precinct 2 Paul Williams, Commissioner Precinct 3 Marshall Millican, Commissioner Precinct 4 Joe Sefcik, and County Clerk Monica Reyes.

The meeting was opened with the pledge to the flag and prayer was offered by Judge Spain.

Judge Spain announced the presence of a quorum.

Commissioner Millican moved to approve the minutes for July 9, 2019. The motion, seconded by Commissioner Robertson, carried.

No action was taken on the burn ban.

Commissioner Sefcik made a motion to approve the donation of crushed limestone road material from AEP and was seconded by Commissioner Millican. The motion carried.
