To the folks of Precinct 2 Paul Williams, from **Commissioner:**

When I ran for County

Commissioner of Precinct 2 a few years ago, I made only a couple of promises - I would not lie to you, and I would know the budget. I apologize in advance for the length of this letter. I have a lot of information for you that I believe is essential. I want each of you to know that I ran for the office because I love this community, I love living here and I desired to serve you in a more substantial manner.

I am writing this letter to keep you informed as to the goingson of your Coke County government. All numbers will be presented as approximations. Should you want to review the details, please feel free to drop by the Coke County courthouse in Robert Lee or give me a call. We will have several hearings and meetings prior to the new budget year starting October 1, 2017.

One of the more frequent conversations that I have with folks is questioning how the county spends your hard-earned dollars. Constitutionally, in the State of Texas most of the county's expenditures are mandated, meaning that Coke County "shall" expend tax dollars on a variety of offices et Examples of these offices al. are the County Judge, County Clerk, Tax Assessor, Sheriff, Treasurer, Auditor. JP,

Constable, and the Commissioners. Your Precinct 2 budget next year will represent about 7% of the total budget of Coke County. In Precinct 2, our Road and Bridge budget for 2017/2018 is proposed at \$189,000. We now have 1.5 road hands for each precinct (I am told that some years ago there were 4 hands for each precinct) and we have about 90 miles of roads to maintain. In 2016, (Continued on page 8)
