#### Time nears for re-registration of marks and brands

Every ten years, Texas requires that marks and brands be re-registered in the county or counties in which you operate. The next reregistration period begins August 31, 2011, and concludes February 29, 2012. After the conclusion date, all marks and brands that have not been re-registered are automatically available for registration by another party. The cost of registering brands in Coke County is \$16.00. Each additional location is \$5.00 if registered at the same time.

Blackwell CISD will be transporting all athletes (14 and older) who have parental permission to Midland for a heart screening by the effective method of detecting

Championship Heart Foundation. The bus will leave Saturday morning at 8 am.

This screening is free and will use two tests to detect Hypertrophic

Cardiomyopathy (HCM), a genetic heart disorder that rarely has identifiable symptoms. HCM is a condition which causes a thickening of the heart wall and can lead to obstruction of blood flow and an erratic heartbeat.

A brief, non-invasive, twodimensional echocardiogram by a certified technician and interpreted by a certified cardiologist has been proven an HMC. Championship Heart Foundation has added an ECG (electrocardiogram) test in addition to the 2-d echocardiogram, which is helpful in detecting other heart diseases in adolescent patients.
