Ricky Royall spoke to Tree Express and they have the city on the list and will be doing work in the next few weeks as weather permits. No action was taken.

Kinley Pritchard made the motion to approve the amended Ordinance 21-01 Cargo, Shipping, and Sea Container. He was seconded by Gwen Dyess and the motion carried with a vote of 4 - 0. Ordinance 21-01 will be effective after the notice is published in the newspaper on May 7, 2021.

Teresa Ballard discussed the need to amend the 2020-2021 budget for municipal purposes regarding the General, Water, Sewer, and Sanitation Fund to transfer budget expenses. Santiago Rodriguez made the motion to approve the amendment and was seconded by Kinley Pritchard. The motion carried with a vote of 4

Financial consultant Everett Bedford brought to the council's attention that it appears that Eckert auditors did not adjust receivables from the yearly audit. He plans on looking at it again at the end of this month and if in fact receivables were not adjusted, then adjusting entries will be made. Accounts payable is possibly off at year end. Mr. Bedford recommends putting out bids for new auditors. Auditors should be changed every three years anyway. Eckert will be notified if in fact an error was made on their part.

Santiago Rodriugez pointed out water fund checks for March that the first two show as not available. \$315.42 was written to Faubion and Robert Lee's transfer to water debt fund of \$8643.64.

Ron Cooper made the motion to approve the following items: regular meeting minutes for March 18, 2021; March aging report; February Balance Sheet and Revenues and Expenditures; and March finance reports (bills paid, check register, bank reconciliation for General, Water, Sewer, Sanitation, and Cemetery funds). He was seconded by Santiago Rodriguez and the motion carried with a vote of 4 - 0.

There will be a presentation on the water treatment plant next month and there is still a lot of work to be done in the coming weeks.


