Virus continues to decline across Texas

Covid-19 numbers in Coke County, like the rest of Texas, continue to fall signaling the end of the Covid-19 pandemic. The two most positive indicators of this decline are the active case percentage (the lower, the better) and the recovery percentage (the higher, the better). Texas began the month with an active case percentage of 32.76% and stood at 23.43% on August 16, falling almost 10% in just over two weeks. The recovery rate began the month at 65.64% and this number was 74.60% on August 16, gaining almost 10% in just over two weeks.

Daily new cases of the virus began August with 9,539 new cases on the first of the month. Fortunately, that was the high day for the month. On August 16, that number was down over 30% to 6,204 daily new cases.

Texas began the month with 141,044 active cases of Covid-19. Fortunately, it has shown a daily decline falling to 125,487 on August 16.

The number of Texans hospitalized for this virus also continues to fall beginning the month at 8,969 and posting 6,267 on August 16, a 30% decrease in just over two weeks.

Daily fatality numbers have bounced around from a low of 31 on August 10th to a high of 324 on August 12th. Part of this is due to a changes in the requirements Many reporting reporting. miscommunications have occurred throughout these months in various categories, usually making the pandemic appear worse than it may

In Coke County, the news is completely positive. This is best shown by the statement released last week by Coke County Judge Hal Spain.

"The news keeps getting better and better concerning our pandemic numbers in Coke County. As of Thursday, August 13, there are only three active COVID cases in the county, compared to twenty the week prior. All the current cases are located in Robert Lee.

According to DSHS, Coke County has accumulated a total of 42 cases, with 3 active, 34 recovered, 3 deceased, and 2 lost to follow-up. This is very good news as we enter the new school year. Numbers are also trending down throughout the state and nation. We are a long way from declaring a victory, but with the release of a new vaccine pending sometime this fall, we are confident that success is just beyond the horizon. Until that time, please continue to follow Daily New Cases the guidelines concerning social distancing, wearing masks, and avoiding large gatherings.


