Notes from the Game Warden

My name is Dan Waddell, and I am your local game warden in Coke County. With the 2022 hunting season just around the corner, I'd like to take a few minutes to make you aware of some changes coming your way.

In 2021, the state legislature mandated that TPWD develop and implement digital tagging for deer, turkey, and oversized red drum. After a year of developing procedures and testing applications, digital tagging is being introduced for the upcoming season in a limited fashion. For this year, digital tags are provided to those who purchase a digital super combo license, a digital senior super combo, or a digital lifetime super combo online. Purchasers of these super combo licenses can opt for a paper license instead. All other licenses purchased at retailers or at TPWD offices remain in paper format with detachable tags.

To view digital licenses and use digital tags, hunters will have to download a phone app called My Texas Hunt Harvest (MTHH). Once opened, you can connect this app to your license account using your name and customer number. In the field, regardless of service availability, hunters will have immediate access to licenses and tags via the MTHH app. If

checked by a game warden, use the app to open your license and present your state-issued ID.

Immediately upon harvesting a deer or turkey, open the MTHH app and follow the directions for digitally tagging and reporting your harvest. If you have cell service, submit the report, legibly write the confirmation number on a durable material, and attach to the harvested animal. If you do not have cell service, open the app, and fill out the harvest report. Then write your first and last name, hunting license number, and date and time of harvest on a durable material and attach it to the harvested animal. When your phone re-establishes service, you must submit the harvest report and legibly write the confirmation number on the durable material attached to the carcass.

All license endorsements on digital licenses will be provided digitally also, except for Federal Duck Stamps.

Hufstutler

Gale Hufstutler passed from this life Saturday evening August 13, 2022, at the age of 94. He will be sorely missed by all who knew him.

Gale was born at Hall Valley, Texas, in San Saba County on March 29, 1928, to Henry Jefferson Hufstutler and Della Luticia (Wicker) Hufstutler. Gale was baptized in San Angelo and graduated high school in Rochelle, Texas, in May of 1944. After school he went to work for West Texas Utilities and, on May 15, 1949, married his wife Leona Mae (McQueen) Hufstutler. Gale was drafted and served in Korea with the 712th Transportation Rail Operations Battalion, Company B in 1953 and '54. Returning home, he earned a Bachelor's of Science degree in Electrical Engineering from Texas Tech in 1957 and was honorably discharged from the Army with the rank of SGT(T) in 1961. Gale was a licensed Engineer and pursued a 38 year career in the defense industry starting with Melpar in Virginia and ultimately retiring from Lockheed Martin in Texas in 1991. He was instrumental in many early achievements in avionics and weapons guidance

technology and had key roles in the A-7 program and the DFW airport AirTrans system.

Gale was devoted to his family and was always willing to serve and help friends and family when needed. He was an elder at St. Barnabas Presbyterian Church in Richardson, volunteered for Habitat for Humanity, and was involved in various interests including his lifelong interests in music and photography.

Gale was preceded in death by his parents and five siblings.

He is survived by his wife of 73 years, Leona Hufstutler; his son, Alan Hufstutler and wife Sue of Merkel, Texas; his daughter, Traci Iverson, husband David and granddaughters Alyssa Iverson and Kathryn Iverson, of Houston, Texas; sister-in-law, Frances McQueen of San Angelo; niece, Susan McQueen of Plano, Texas; and nephew, Jim McQueen and wife Nancy of California. Gale is also survived by grandsons, Nickolas and wife Brittney of Abilene, Texas, Chad and wife Jessie of Alma, Michigan, and Jeremy and wife Liz of Grand Rapids, Michigan; along with great grandchildren, Tristan, Evie, Nathaniel, Benjamin, Reagan and Kennedy.

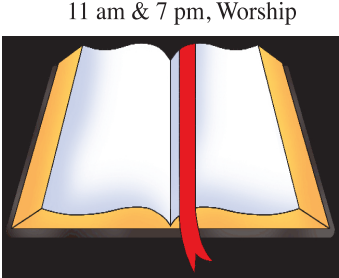
