The Board of Directors of the West Coke County Hospital District met in regular session July 27, 2021, in the old jail annex.

President Beverly Burdett called the meeting to order at 9:39 am and declared a quorum was present.

Roger Alexander led the invocation.

Board members present were Noel Tinkler, Pat Stephens and Judie Andrews. Houston McGuire, Administrator, Janie Munoz, BOM, Chris Martin, Consultant and Roger Alexander, Consultant, were also present at the meeting.

The minutes from the previous meetings were approved and absentee Judie Andrews was excused.

There were no visitors.

In the staffing update, there is still a need for an RN. After mid-August, the slate of CNAs will be full.

There are currently 46 residents as of the meeting date and the DSO stands at 51. The Board was provided with an update on the QIPP program and things are running smoothly.

We are still waiting on a bid from Danco on some electrical work that must be done at the facility and the possibility was discussed about looking for someone to address some of the smaller preliminary electrical items and paving the way for the major work.

The conference room restoration has begun at the facility level and Houston will soon be able to hire a contractor to complete the work.

The landscaping is a work in progress and looking beautiful. The west side and half the yard by the gazebo has been completed. The work is being done by Crosscuts Landscaping of Robert Lee, owned and operated by Logan Philley.

The new IT company, Snyder IT, now has the facility in its system and is running smoothly. Houston will meet with Frontier

to discuss internet.

The Board voted on some property bids.

There will be a Budget Workshop August 13, 2021.

Future agenda items were discussed and the next meeting date is August 31, 2021.

The meeting adjourned.

The Context of Jobs

When I set out several weeks ago to pen an essay on rural job creation, I did not intend to turn this into a multi-month series. But as I dove in to the first essay, it became apparent that, if we truly want to make an impact, create jobs, and see our communities grow, we need to examine the topic in all of its complexity, dimension, and importance.

Strengthening our economy via good, stable jobs is a task that underlies every other topic that we discuss in revitalizing our rural communities. Does your city need to improve its infrastructure? It needs to grow its tax base (in Texas, that means both sales tax and property tax) to pay for those improvements. Do you want to increase your population? Most people still in the labor force do not move to a town with a job or a prospect thereof. Do you want more amenities in town, from better
