My name is Roma Johnson Holley. The story of my life began in Nolan County where our family had a small farm/ranch. My parents, Herman (d.1995) and Irene Johnson (d.1998), were hardworking, Christian individuals who instilled the same hardworking, Christian traits in myself and my brother, Russell Johnson. We moved to Bronte in the fall of 1976 because of my father's ill health. My mother re-established her nursing career at the Bronte Nursing Home. She was a dedicated caregiver there for many years when she finally semi-retired. I say semiretired because she was still nursing part-time at Robert Lee Nursing home at the time of her passing.



Russell and I both graduated from Bronte High School in 1980 and 1981, respectively. We both left to pursue careers and Russell's journey led him back to Coke County where he was in law enforcement for many years before being elected Coke County Justice of the Peace in 2018.

My journey led me to adventures in many countries and states and although I moved back for a while to Bronte in 1996, I finally settled in Eastland, Texas. There my life became entrenched in family life, school and work. My husband and I have a blended family of 4 children and that meant a lot of activities. We always said that if we can just get the kids raised and out of the house that we could survive anything. Well, that statement was put to the test on June 28, 2012, when we were faced with a parent's worst nightmares. Our youngest son, Zachary Shephard, was killed in a vehicle accident in Andrews County. He was only 21 years young.

I don't pretend to be an expert on how to handle grief. I only know what my experience has taught me. It's been said that experience is the best teacher. Well, I would probably have to agree. I never thought that I would write a book that deals with grief. I mean, think about it, who wants to deal with grief? But this experience was thrust upon me and there was no escape. Facebook became one of my coping mechanisms. I could write out everything that I was feeling and I always felt better afterwards. After 5 years of my journey through grief over the loss of my son, I realized that some of my writings were actually helping other people who were reading them. So, I decided to combine my Facebook postings into a book along with some of my other writings. The result is "SURVIVING THE STORM THROUGH THE WIND OF THE SPIRIT: MY JOURNEY

My hope is that this book will teach by my example, how to live life on purpose; how to not let the past define our future; and how to keep on keeping on when the light of life has become so dim as to be unseen. For it is when we become blind and unseeing that we depend upon someone else for help. "My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth" Psalm 121:2. God has allowed the Holy Spirit to sustain me, strengthen me, comfort me and most importantly, Guide Me.

I must confess, I do not think of myself as an "author". I think of myself as a wife, a mother, a grandmother, a sister, and many other things, but "author" is not one of the descriptors. First and foremost, I think of myself as an humble servant of God.
