Commissioner Robertson moved to adopt the General Tax Rate for the fiscal year 2018-2019 and was seconded by Commissioner Millican. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Commissioner Sefcik moved to adopt the Road and Bridge tax rate for the fiscal year 2018-2019 and was seconded by Commissioner Robertson. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Commissioner Williams moved to adopt the General Budget for the fiscal year 2018-2019 and was seconded by Commissioner Millican. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Commissioner Sefcik moved to adopt the Road and Bridge budget for the fiscal year 2018-2019 and was seconded by Commissioner Williams. All voted in favor and the motion carried

No action was taken on the salary funding from MHMR for Coke County Mental Health Officers.

Commissioner Williams moved to appoint Election Judges and Alternates as presented and was seconded by Commissioner Sefcik. The motion carried.

Commissioner Williams moved to allow the use of the Justice of the Peace office (room 10) for the Election Room. The
