This workshop covers general ideas about the ACT test as a whole and the individual sections of English (including what the testmakers are looking for and the relevant English rules needed for the test), Math (including exactly what formulas and rules you will need to answer virtually every question), Reading (including three strategies on how to best take the reading comprehension section), and Science (including common question types and strategies to understand and beat the science reasoning section).

The Bronte ISD Board of Trustees held a Regular Board Meeting on July 23, 2015, starting at 7:10 pm.

The Bronte ISD Board of Trustee Meeting opened with prayer by Blake Braswell

A quorum was established with 7 members present.

There were no audience items. The minutes from the previous meeting required a correction; the special meeting was adjourned at 6:50 and the erroneous adjournment line item was deleted. Blake Braswell made a motion and David McWright seconded to approve the minutes with corrections as noted. Ayes: 6, Nayes: 0,

The July bills were discussed;

they are a little higher this month due to some annual payments made during this month. Motion was made by David McWright and seconded by Nick Arrott to approve the July bills. Ayes: 7, Nayes: 0

Mr. Siler, Superintendent, reported the financial status for the district to the board. Based on the current state of affairs and barring any major issues, the district should end the year very close to the budgeted amount for 2014-2015. In fact, it is likely that the expenditures will be less than the revenue for the first time in several years.

Poehls, Principal, Donna presented the principal's report. The administration is currently building the school schedules and ordering textbooks. The Code of Conduct is currently in review prior to presentation to the board. Summer school went well. The preliminary testing scores received last month were compared to the Regional and State scores; Bronte appears to have better scores than the region and state in most subjects. Final scores will be available in August.

Mr. Siler presented the property and auto insurance proposals for 2015-2016. The district used TAPS last year; and Mr. Siler recommended we remain with them for the coming year. Motion was made by Blake Braswell and seconded by Kay Styles to approve the 2015-2016 Property and Auto Insurance for \$29,962. from TAPS.

Mr. Siler recommended we maintain the same prices as last year for the season passes for athletic events: \$50.00 for individual and \$75.00 for family

in the same household. Nick Arrott made a motion to approve as recommended and John Seales seconded.

Mr. Siler presented the TASB Risk Management Unemployment Proposal. The district's annual contribution is \$3,827.00. Blake Braswell made a motion and Kay Styles seconded to approve as presented. Ayes: 7, Nayes: 0

Nick Arrott made a motion and Blake Braswell seconded to add Tim Siler as an Authorized Representative to Bronte ISD's Lone Star Investment Pool Account.
