By Bryan Swecker Here w e are in September, with a quiet summer behind us, but we've used that "extra" time to our advantage! First, we were able to secure a grant from the Texas Forest Service to pay for 99% of the cost of training materials (videos, books) that will allow us to train our Firefighters to a Level II Certification. Achieving these certifications provides our department with better trained firefighters, greatly improving their safety and ability when responding to a wide range of emergency situations. As well, it will lower the Insurance risk factor, resulting in lower insurance bills for everyone.

Second, we took on the task of submitting a Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) grant for structural firefighting equip-Going in, we ment. thought it would be a simple written submission, but as time went on it was anything but simple. However, after a little more than a year we had our award! The award paid for all but 5 percent of the cost for 12 full (helmet to boots) sets of structural firefighting gear. New structural equipment is a first for the department, as up to this point we've been issuing used equipment from other departments.

Our improvement efforts aren't stopping here! After these successes, we're now taking on a new project...construction of a new Fire Station. The new station will be located in the fenced lot to the west of the Water

Tower, which is currently our second station now. This facility will house all five of our trucks in a single location, provide much needed classroom training space, and the capability to handle sustained operations (which we hope to never need, but need to be prepared for). At this point we have an initial design, as well as an initial start to the funding. Thanks to federal money we've received for fighting the Wildcat fire and generous donations from individuals and companies in the area, our effort is starting out with just over 10 percent of the estimated cost in the fund. Dillard, Harris wed in ceremony



A tour of the Old Jail is just the beginning of the progression of the future of Coke County's historical preservation. A grand opening of the Old Jail and Annex will be held at a later date. Plans for the Annex include storage of paper and picture historical collections and techni-

cal equipment to allow historians to catalog and copy family histories for the grandchildren and greatgrandchildren who will some day seek a connection to their forefathers and mothers who lived in Coke County. A collective project to chronicle the communities that made Coke County history rich and varied will be enabled by the storage and equipment and workspace planned for the Annex.

At this time, it is the opinion of the Coke County Historical Commission that the Annex does not have space for the addition of anything but paper and picture historical pieces. It is hoped that another building will become available for a museum-type collection of artifacts. The Old Jail building is on the National Register of Historical Places, and, for the time being, will stand as a historical site in itself and its space will be used for regional art shows, personal family collection displays, educational opportunities, and other special projects.
