PUBLIC NOTICE CITY OF ROBERT LEE

In 2017, at the September 11th council meeting, council approved to increase sewer rates. The rates will go into effect immediately.

An ordinance establishing a new schedule of rates for services rendered by the City's Wastewater System, repealing Ordinance #1243.

WHEREAS, the cost of chemicals, materials, utilities maintenance have increased to the point where the current schedule of rates is no longer sufficient to cover the increased cost, and

WHEREAS, it now appears to the City Council that it is necessary and proper to prescribe a new schedule of rates and charges for services rendered by the City's Wastewater System;

THEREFORE, BE ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY ROBERT LEE AS FOLLOWS, TO WIT:

SECTION 1: There shall be charged for sewer service a flat monthly rate:

> Residential - \$18.70 Small Business - \$18.70 Business with Car Wash -\$26.47

Non-Profit Organization -\$18.70

> Motel - \$77.89 RV Park - \$78.28

Restaurant/Café - \$77.89 Business with food preparation/ sales - \$77.89

Laundromat - \$88.20 School & Cafeteria - \$102.06 School Gym & Ag Building -\$102.06

Courthouse - \$92.68 County Park - \$56.08 Golf Course - \$18.70 Nursing Home (East Side) -\$102.16

Nursing Home - (West Side) \$183.40

Housing Authority (\$12.16 per unit) - \$510.51

SECTION 4: By reason of the fact that the City Council considers the passage necessary for the economy and welfare of the citizens of Robert Lee, it is hereby declared duly continued by the City Council. This ordinance shall take effect with the utility billing issued for the month of October, 2017. Said Ordinance was duly passed by affirmative vote.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by those in attendance and prayer was offered by Mayor Pro Tem David Bedford.

The City Council exited into Executive Session at 6:32 pm to discuss with the attorney the pending litigation styled as Ronny Loyd vs City of Bronte. The Council returned from Executive Session at 7:08 pm and Mayor Gohman reported that no action was taken from the Executive Session.

Paul Knight addressed the Council regarding the lease deal Ronny Loyd, transparency and no discussion in public. Addressing the Mayor, Knight asked about the promise of transparency. Attorney Hogg answered Mr. Knight by saying that the Executive Session was to update the Council on the active litigation against the City. All discussions are attorney/client privilege and discussion in public could give away his strategic defense and he advised the Council not to discuss in public about the case. Knight asked how Councilmember Lee Wommack is able to go into Executive Session since he Ronny represented Loyd previously and this is a possible conflict of interest. Wommack commented and said that he is not representing Loyd. Attorney Hogg stated that no public comment can be made since no agenda item of discussion/action was on the agenda.

Marlene Vaughn addressed the Council with a comment about a house on the corner of Barclay and SW Railroad Vaughn stated that streets. Felma Evans' house is going to be put up for sale and the lot next door is ridiculous. It needs to be cleaned up or something done to it. Vaughn does not konw who the owners are but possibly the Council can get this information from the courthouse Vaughn in Robert Lee. expressed her opinion that the lot has not been touched and it is an eye sore. Paul Knight said that it is possibly owned by Rob

Chief DeLaGarza presented the Fire Department Report. Three more applicants have asked to join the Volunteer Fire Department since the house fire. Materials are being bought to start the offices inside the station. This new station is not just for the VFD but for the community and the community is welcome to use it. Chief DeLaGarza received a call from a retired firefighter from Kansas and offered free training. Training will be held in September. Additional training will be done for the younger firefighters in San Angelo for 2 days in October, and then the second part of training will be done in November. DeLaGarza expressed his excitement that the VFD received a grant for bunker gear for 10 firefighters and received \$4000 from United Way for wild land gear to fight grass fires. The spray foam insulation is doing great and is a lifesaver. Chief DeLaGarza added a thank you to the community for the overwhelming support.
