Myers Drug in San Angelo will be hosting a Flu Shot Clinic in Robert Lee, on Wednesday, October 5, from 8 am to 11 am at the Robert Lee Courthouse.

Seasonal flu vaccines protect against the three influenza viruses that research indicates will be most common during the upcoming season. Viruses in the vaccine can change each year, however, about 2 weeks after the vaccination, antibodies that provide protection against the influenza viruses in the vaccine will develop in the body.

The CDC recommends that people get their seasonal flu vaccine as soon as the vaccine becomes available in their community. Vaccination before December is best since this timing ensures that protective antibodies are in place before flu activity is typically at its highest. The CDC encourages people to get vaccinated beginning as

early as October. Over the course of flu season, influenza viruses can circulate at different times and in different places. As long as flu viruses are still spreading in the community, vaccination can provide a protective benefit.
